Deputy Leader and Cabinet Member for Children, Young People and Education

Councillor Ali will deputise for the Leader of the Council in his absence by representing the borough at external events, within the council and chairing Cabinet. She will safeguard children in Southwark and lead policies to support them, including children's social care and early years, the school inclusion agenda. She leads our work with academies and other education providers to improve standards in every school in the borough so that no child is left behind.
