I refer to the Application to vary a premise licence made under the Licensing Act 2003 you recently sent to this Service in respect of the Blue Eyed Maid Public House, 173 Borough High Street, London, SE1 1HR

As you are aware, Trading Standards are able to make representations to the Licensing Authority in respect of this application particularly with respect to the Licensing objective, the Protection of Children from Harm.

Southwark's Licensing Policy states that it expects the operating schedule submitted by each applicant to fully address the steps that the applicant intends to take in order to ensure the protection of children from harm.

In our view, the proposed conditions submitted does not sufficiently outline the particular steps the applicant intends to take to ensure this licensing objective is met and we are of the opinion that, the applicant has not demonstrated compliance with this objective.

There are a number of measures which can be put into place which can help to address this licensing objective including asking for proof of age cards, staff training and signage in respect of restrictions on the sale of alcohol.

I invite the applicant to submit additional information which will outline the steps they intend to take in this area and when this is received we will reconsider our representations to the Licensing Authority.

I would be happy to receive any additional information by email and it is not necessary to re-submit any forms.

I have attached for your information recommended conditions that we find acceptable.

Our client has confirmed they are prepared to undertake the following measures;

- A challenge 21 policy will be employed whereby those individuals who appear to be under the age of 21 and are attempting to purchase alcohol will be asked for identification. The only type of identification that will be accepted is a photo driving licence, passport or PASS accredited identification.
- Staff will be trained in the challenge 21 policy and records will be kept.
- Signs will be erected informing that alcohol will not be sold to under 18's and advising of the challenge 21 policy.
