Re:-Ibbs/ Legacy restaurant 53 Camberwell Road SE5 0EZ

Police are in possession of an application for a review of the above premises licence in relation to the following licensing objectives.

The prevention of crime and disorder, public safety, the prevention of public nuisance

The application provides details of the concerns they have with regard to the operation of the premises, the continued noise and nuisance disturbance caused by patrons most weekends and allegations of potential crime and disorder associated with the premises.

The police have the following comment to make in relation to this application to review the premises licence.

I have carried out searches on the police intelligence and recording systems and found the following in the year.

17/10/21-At 0226hrs Police attended the location on Camberwell road/Boyson road where they observed the venue still carrying licensable activities outside of their terminal hour and allowing customers to leave and re-enter the venue after 0230hrs. It was further seen patrons leaving making noise by talking very loudly and also consuming alcohol from bottles despite no off sales, a breach of licence condition 298/308/342

07/11/21-At 0203hrs Police observed patrons of Ibbs stood outside drinking from plastic cups none were smoking and they were in loud conversation. Everytime the door to the premises opened loud music would emanate, again patrons seen entering the premises and not being searched . Form 694 and 699 issued.

12/11/21-At 0010hrs Police and Southwark council officers attended the location of John Ruskin Street/Boyson road where witnessed a male urinating in the street, when approached stated he had been drinking in Ibbs, he was advised to go home however he stated he wasn't going home yet and he walked off. It was also observed by officers that people were leaving the premises and re-entering the premises without any further searches a breach of licence condition 342/348.

13/11/21-At 1942 we attended Boyson road where we saw 6 ladies stood and taking part in aloud discussion, only 3 of ladies were smoking , police approached SIA at Ibbs and were told that the ladies were not their customers however after speaking to the ladies they then all entered Ibbs without being searched. There were also 6 males and a female stood in Boyson road drinking from plastic cups all of whom entered Ibbs.

30/11/21-Police object to TEN for venue based on ongoing ASB in area.

05/03/22 -At 0115hrs males seen urinating in street and then to enter Ibbs.

02/04/22- At 0230hrs patrons leaving ibbs and urinating in Boyson street, Loud music played in cars.

30/04/22-At 0250hrs police observe loud music emanating from ibbs despite being after terminal hour for licensable activities .Form 694 issued.

12/06/22-Homophobic Abh outside venue , no calls to Police by venue both victim and suspect were intoxicated and were patrons.

I found a number of calls in the locality of the premises that mention the venues patrons as being the core problem but could not directly link them to the operation of 53 Camberwell Road as a number of premise operate in the area.

Environment Protection Responsible Authority (EPRA) has considered a Review for the above address and would like to make a representation in support of the review under the prevention of public nuisance licensing objective.

EPT records show numerous complaints to the Council as far back as 26/12/2012. The restaurant is close to residential premises and has a long history of causing a public nuisance. The Environmental Protection and Noise Team have received several complaints and have made several visits to the premises about loud music and public nuisance.

Public nuisance was caused by patrons' screaming, fighting, congregating outside, loud music blasting out of cars and the premises, etc., and management has no confidence in resolving the matter and preventing a nuisance from occurring. The review application set out a catalogue of events describing the impact of the restaurant on the nearby residents
