
Windsor Walk - Denmark Hill Station

accessibility improvement

Consultation Report

September 2022



Introduction

This report is produced by the London Borough of Southwark Highways team to provide a summary on the consultation exercise for the improvements in late 2020.

Network Rail have provided a new Denmark Hill station and cycle hub at Denmark Hill to relieve station crowding and support more reliable train services.

Southwark Council welcomes these improvements and has committed to make disability access, walking and cycling easier to and from the station. We're proposing below measures

- 1. Decluttering the pavement/ removing unnecessary signs
- 2. Widening the pavement from the new station entrance by removing 7 short stay/permit parking bays
- 3. Installing a new disabled drop-off bay
- 4. Replacing the planters on the bridge with bollards to create more space for cyclists and to prevent illegal car parking on the bridge
- 5. Moving the bollard line to the kerb on Champion Park to prevent parked cars obstructing the pelican crossing
- 6. installing cycle parking on the new kerbline, maximising access for both walking and cycling
- 7. providing a safe, step-free crossing between the station and the hospital

Public consultation on these measures was held between 4 July 2022 and 7 August 2022. After the measures were installed, to inform whether these measures should be made, permanent, modified, or removed. All local residents, businesses, commuters and disabled people who travelled through the area were invited to participate on the proposals.

Consultation Process

First of all, mailing lists were extracted from Southwark's Smart2 GIS mapping system and database.


Letters were sent out on the end-June 2022 to notify residents and businesses that the consultation would be opened from 4 July 2022 to 7 August 2022, and people are welcome to take part in the survey to leave comments.

Total 12 posters were put up on the lamp posts of Windsor Walk and both Denmark Hill station entrances with the consent of Network Rail.

Letter addresses to the consultees to respond to the consultation via the Council's online **consultation portal**. It also included a consultation link (<u>How can we make Windsor Walk more accessible? - London Borough of Southwark - Citizen Space</u>) to respond and a freepost address to request paper copies of the survey.

All letters were delivered by Royal Mail.





















In this survey, five disabled people told us what they think about the design elements. As the table above indicate, 5 people with disabilities preferred to retain the measures or extend them. Four of them strongly support the installation of disabled drop off bay but one against it. Four of them strongly support widening the pavement and decluttering the pavement whereas one of them support these elements. One out of five disabled people strongly support replacing planters with bollards to prevent illegal parking and create more space.







What is your age?






What do you consider to be your ethnic background?


What is your sex as recorded at birth?


Is your Gender Identity the same as the sex you were recorded at birth?

Findings from responses

Key findings

> Support the proposed measures on Windsor Walk

85% of respondents (39 out of 46 respondents) were in favour of the installation of disabled drop off bay

91% of respondents (42 out of 46 respondents) were in favour of decluttering the pavement/removing unnecessary signs

83% of respondents (38 out of 46 respondents) were in favour of widening the pavement 61% of respondents (28 out of 46 respondents) were in favour of replacing the planters with bollards to prevent illegal parking and create more space

89% of respondents (41 out of 46 respondents) were in favour of installing a step-free crossing between the new entrance and the hospital.

> Agreement with statements

- 78% of respondents think that the scheme will improve pedestrian accessibility.
- 59 of respondents think the scheme will improve cycle accessibility.
- 72% of respondents think that the scheme will improve pedestrian safety.
- 81% of respondents think that the scheme will improve wheelchair accessibility.

Overall, majority of respondents strongly agree and agree the scheme will deliver the objectives of the scheme in Windsor Walk

Recommendation

We would recommend decluttering the pavement and widening the footway to support the great footfalls near Denmark Hill new entrance based on the findings from this consultation.

Support disabled people and old people

We would recommend to wider the pavements, step-free access crossings and disabled drop-off bay based on this consultation. It might help them to have more confident to walk and use their wheelchair or mobility scooter easily

Support local business:

Based on the consultation responses, we would recommend coordinating the space with the pub, café and the veg and fruit market stall to allow more space for pedestrians and cyclists to walk from/to the station.

Reassessment of proposed design elements:

- > Reassess the provision of facilities for pregnant women to go for the appointments at Fetal Medicine Research Institute.
- > Reassess the safety elements for mixing pedestrians and cyclists to use the space on Windsor Walk bridge
- Reassess the provision of trees
