The school puts great value on outdoor learning and has a dedicated outdoor learning coordinator. Whilst being 100% committed to the benefits of green space and outdoor learning, the school is suffering with lack of expertise, time and resources to maintain the gardens and bring gardening into the curriculum. The gardens are neglected despite this enthusiasm, purely due to budget constraints. The school's demographic is changing, with parents becoming more engaged. We want to encourage this engagement by including our wider school community (parents/carers/friends of the school) in this initiative. We aim to work with Grow Your Own Playground to bring a dedicated gardener and workshop provider into school for 1 day each fortnight to deliver high-quality curriculum-linked workshops to all pupils whilst also maintaining the gardens they create. They will also help organise community planting and skills days and corporate volunteering sessions. Pupils and their families will become inspired by gardening and learn life-long skills. Air quality monitoring sites close to John Donne show dangerously high levels of NO2 (above EU legal limits) - average 53µg/m3. Thanks to CGS funding, the school has added a protective ivy green screen increasing protection from surrounding roads. Despite the new green screen, there are still concerns about air pollution in the area. The area scores 1 (worst possible score) for access to public open space on the London Green Infrastructure Map, meaning residents have little access to greenspace. Our Urban Heat Island score is 0.85 - the highest climate, flood and heat risk. Residents are at the highest risk of climate change AND are more vulnerable to such risks due to personal/social factors affecting their ability to cope with extreme events. Anxiety and mental health concerns are extremely high.</p>	£8,832

1888	SE15 Community Fund	SE15 CF - Close the Gap Campaign	<p>The SE15 Community Fund offers financial grants to people located in the SE15 postcode, who may be struggling, with grants available up to £50 per month per household. This fund can be used for any purpose. We are a group of SE15 based neighbours who believe in helping our neighbours when they are in need - on the basis of solidarity, not charity.</p> <p>The inequalities in Peckham are stark: 42% of children are growing up in poverty in Peckham ward (ECP Study, 2018), while there is a difference of 8 years life expectancy between that ward and nearby Dulwich Village (ONS). With winter arriving soon and a spiralling cost of living crisis, we anticipate an increase in demand for the Fund.</p> <p>Since its creation, the Fund has distributed nearly £50,000 to over 100 different neighbours. The Fund has supported neighbours paying for essential groceries, utilities, childcare and accommodation. Whilst this support from the local community and other grants has been essential and heartening to see, demand is now far outstripping supply. As a result, we have not been able to continue our vital outreach work which aims to reach the whole SE15 postcode. Even with the halting of outreach work, the fund is currently running on roughly a 4 week backlog, meaning that neighbours submitting grant applications have to wait a month before receiving funds. Each month the gap between contributions and expenses is between £750-£1000.</p> <p>A grant will allow us to clear this backlog and continue working within our current model throughout 2023 whilst we create a new fundraising strategy with the help of our collaborators Future Strategy Club - a local creative agency - eventually leading to the re-engagement with those in need within our postcode.</p>	£25,000

2242	The Ivy Club	The Ivy Club	<p>The project is aimed at over 50's residents of the Lane and Nunhead Wards, (many are over 65)l. Its aim is to provide wellbeing activities and a social interaction platform combatting isolation and improving physical and mental wellbeing, increasing independence and resilience of the elderly local communities. We provide access to appropriate physical activities such as chair based exercises and a space for social activities combatting isolation such as arts and crafts, knitting and peer activity around a chosen activity. An IT expert, recommended by Southwark Council attends every week to give assistance around laptops and mobile phones. A number of members have formed a singing group called The Green Singers and they sing every week and often sing when local events are taking place.</p> <p>Four people with learning difficulties attend with their carers every week. We took 52 members to Eastbourne this year and for many, this was their first time outside of London, and for some, their local area, since lockdown. The absolute pleasure this caused was humbling. We have organised a coach trip to Rochester Christmas Market. We have a programme of weekly activities booked up until Christmas and are in the progress of planning activities for 2023. Our activities calendar is planned by the residents who attend the club.</p> <p>Many of the Ivy Club members are expressing concerns around the cost of living, and in particular around their heating bills. We are planning to extend our activities to a second day to provide a warm hub and looking at what we need to provide to make this a possibility, eg, hot food, woolen scarves, gloves etc as well as practical advice about how to stay warm and safe. 2082	The Music Klub Project CIC	Trading Faces	<p>We intend to start a programme called "Trading Faces" for young people from BAME communities who are 16 to 21 years old and come from difficult backgrounds, such as those who live in the East Central Multi Ward area and have regularly experienced declines in their mental health due to the emergence of the pandemic as well as those young people who are now susceptible to episodes of mental fragility due to Covid-19. 'Trading Faces' is a project about managing your mental health with music and implementing a number of practises and techniques designed to strengthen your mindset and develop effective coping mechanisms to combat bouts of depression and anxiety.</p> <p>Developed initially by the young people we work with, we believe the project will provide a platform for young people to express themselves and free them from the mental shackles that society can impose by dictating their every move. Through a series of songwriting and music production workshops designed to help each young person revitalise and rejuvenate their mental health, participants will be tasked with creating music that has a positive influence. We intend to teach participants a variety of expressive artistic practises such as rhyming, repetition, metaphor, imagery, concepts, and the fundamentals of repeatability, which will enable them to create sophisticated pieces of art that represent the past, present, and future, as well as provide a detailed narrative about their experiences with social media. To achieve this, we aim to run weekly 3-hour workshop drop in sessions at the Nunhead Green Community Centre.</p> <p>The project will develop positive solutions that will enable young people to make informed decisions by providing participants with a clear understanding of the perceptions surrounding the power of music and the beneficial tools it can provide to one's mental health.</p>	£4,773
