The Arch Company

Arch Co represent 800 properties in Southwark, mostly railway arches, and have been redeveloping disused spaces to be used for a variety of small businesses. They have requested the cycle lane reverts to a single lane for the following reasons.

The railway arches in Bermondsey have long been used for food distribution and other industrial uses.

The installation of the bi-directional segregated cycling lane on Druid Street has reduced the available space on the carriageway and is making loading and unloading operations more difficult.

This has led to some businesses indicating that would like to relocate their operations. If light industrial use of the arches is no longer feasible, the arches are likely to used by hospitality businesses, of which the residents have voiced disapproval of due to noise and disruption.
