## RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Note the size and composition of the Overview and Scrutiny committee, to be agreed by annual council assembly (paragraph 4).
2. Appoint scrutiny commissions and agree their titles, size and remits, including which scrutiny body has responsibility for crime and disorder and health matters.
3. Appoint chairs and vice-chairs for the commissions.

## BACKGROUND INFORMATION

4. The annual council assembly meeting on 20 May 2023 is due to appoint an Overview and Scrutiny Committee (OSC) with 11 places (9 Lab, 2 Lib Dem). The chair and vice-chair will be appointed at this meeting also.
5. It is for the overview and scrutiny committee to appoint scrutiny commissions.

## KEY ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION

6. OSC is asked to:
  - Appoint commissions for 2023/24 and agree their title, size, composition and remit,
  - Appoint the chairs and vice-chairs of the commissions,
  - Determine whether scrutiny of crime and disorder and health matters are allocated to a commission(s) or retained by OSC.
7. In 2022/23, four commissions were appointed, 'Education and Local Economy Scrutiny Commission, Environment and Community Engagement Scrutiny

Commission, Health and Social Care Scrutiny Commission, and Housing and Community Safety Scrutiny Commission.

8. Political groups are entitled to the same number of reserve members as the number of seats they have on each Committee/Sub-Committee.
9. The most proportionate allocation will depend on the number of members on the commission. In 2022/23 the commissions were established with seven seats.

10. Co-opted member places in 2022/23 were:

- a. Overview and Scrutiny Committee (Education matters only):

Education matters - voting co-opted members, Church of England and Catholic diocesan representatives, two elected parent governor representatives.

- b. Education and Local Economy Scrutiny Commission:

Education matters - voting co-opted members, Church of England and Catholic diocesan representatives, two elected parent governor representatives

- c. Environment and Community Engagement Scrutiny Commission

Environment – two non-voting co-opted members were appointed by the commission

- d. Housing and Community Safety Scrutiny Commission

Housing matters<sup>1</sup> - one non-voting co-opted member from Tenants Forum, Homeowners Forum and Southwark Tenant Management Organisations Committee.

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<sup>1</sup> Cabinet at its meeting on 4 February 2020 considered an item on the Southwark Resident Participation Framework. As part of cabinet's decision, it recommended that the housing scrutiny commission have nominated places (one place each) for Tenants Forum, Homeowners Forum
