Police are in possession of an application from the above for a New Premises Licence for Regulated Entertainment, Late Night Refreshment, The Supply of Alcohol on sales .The application describes the premises as a Bar and Kitchen.

The premises is situated in the Peckham Major Town Centre as defined by Southwark's Statement of licensing policy .The venue is also within the Peckham Cumulative Impact Zone.

The hours requested for Sunday to Thursday are within those recommended by Southwark's Statement of licensing Policy for Bars in such an area however those requested for Friday-Saturday are outside the policy.

The recommended closing times for Bars/Restaurants in Major Town Centre areas are:

Sun-Thurs – 2300hrs  
Fri-Sat-0000hrs

The premises are situated in the Borough and Bankside Cumulative impact Zone (CIZ) as designated by Southwark Council. The High Court approval of Cumulative impact policies came in Westminster City Council v Middlesex Crown Court. In brief, it stated 'A licence could be refused on the sole ground that the area was already saturated with licensed premises'

The applicant has offered some control measures in the operating schedule however before commenting we would like more details to the operation in regards to the events taking place and the hiring of the venue by 3<sup>rd</sup> parties before we can comment. The Home office guidance issued under Sec 182 of the licensing Act 2003 'General principles' state that it is important in setting the parameters within which the premises may operate. Conditions must be precise and enforceable.

The area of the premises has been subject over a number of years to alcohol related Anti-Social Behaviour and we would like to see the applicant apply robust conditions.

My representations are made with regard to the weekend hours being outside that of licensing policy further information being required in regard to the type of events to be held and that all four of the licensing objectives in particular the Prevention of crime and disorder have not been addressed sufficiently. It is for this reason that I object to this application in its current format. Police welcome the opportunity to progress this application.

I wish to make a representation on behalf of Southwark Environmental Protection Team (EPT) in our capacity as Environmental Health Responsible Authority, about the likely effect of the sought licence if granted on the promotion of the 'prevention of public nuisance' licensing objective. Our representation is simply to seek an assurance from the applicant he agrees:

- That the the proposed conditions in 'Operating Schedule' are incorporated into the new licence in enforceable format.

We also recommend the following additional conditions:

- All external plant required for the operation of the premises (air handling plant, condensers, kitchen extraction systems, etc.) shall be designed, installed and maintained to ensure that noise output from the external plant does not cause a public nuisance or intrude inside the nearest, or most exposed, noise sensitive premises.
- Any kitchen extraction system required for the operation of the premises shall be installed with an appropriate discharge location (i.e. eaves height) and with adequate odour control filters installed and maintained to ensure that odour emissions do not cause a public nuisance or intrude inside in the nearest or most exposed sensitive premises.

We would happy to withdraw our representation if the applicant agrees to the above.
