I note our records (attached here) have shown an a number of complaints from residents regarding loud music and patron noise. Our noise team have attended to some of these complaints but they have not been able to establish nuisance. A few residents have been declining visit to their properties when officers explained to them that this is important part of assessment.

As concerned residents, we have the right to enjoy a peaceful and quiet environment within our community, and it is crucial that the council upholds these rights".

Therefore, although I am not supporting review of the premises licence, I however strongly recommend that we monitor the premises through NTE and at the same time advising the resident of the Noise Team services.
