Cllr Simmons has requested a change to the proposed operating times to 7.45-9.00am and 2.45-4.30pm in order to accommodate the operating times of all schools that might be affected by the road closures. In addition, that officers could implement the school street scheme by November 2023.

ADDITIONAL ADVICE RECEIVED

Officers recommend that the proposals from Cllr Simmons are accepted by the Cabinet Member. Following the Scrutiny call in period, further discussions will take place with local councillors to agree the operating times to be taken forward for the Traffic Management Order (TMO). The proposed TMO operating times are almost within the timescales envelope of 7.30-9.30am and 3-5pm, no further formal decision would be required. Officers will work to achieve the November 2023 deadline but this will be dependent on either Scrutiny call in or objections received to the TMO.
