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Southwark's Children in Care Council and officially turned 20 years old in 2023. We are managed by Southwark's Children's Rights service and sit within the Quality Assurance department. We are supported by one full-time Children's Rights & Officer, whose purpose is to champion the rights of Southwark's care experienced C&YP (aged 5-25). The Children's Rights Officer is also responsible for supporting some Children in Need who are subject to child protection plans.

As from April 2023, the Virtual School provided further support in the part funding of a second Children's Rights Officer. This was to assist with the demands of the service and to extend SpeakerBox's reach.

In line with Article 12 of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC) SpeakerBox encourages opportunities for C&YP to feel empowered in expressing their wishes and feelings, whilst ensuring their views are valued and not disregarded.

MISSION & PURPOSE

Empowering, upskilling and equipping our Southwark C&YP with the tools to self-advocate whilst amplifying the voices of all our care experienced C&YP. Doing so in partnership with the Virtual School.



During the past year we worked in partnership with Southwark's Virtual School. The Virtual School were instrumental in supporting our growth. Their contributions helped finance fresh and innovative opportunities that upskilled and enabled our abilities to contribute to decisions that affect our lives. We have now come out of our shells, grown in confidence and are now able to participate more effectively and creatively. We have been able to demonstrate our new acquired skills through care planning, consultations, facilitating training and the recruitment of social work staff and students.

The Virtual School's generous contributions have enabled opportunities for us to expand our reach. We have now developed new platforms where we feel empowered in advocating, not only for ourselves, but all Southwark care experienced children and young people.




THERE WERE 1005 ENGAGEMENT EPISODES

There were a total of **1005** engagement episodes where we (as C&YP), participated throughout the past year. We delivered training, campaigned, informed service delivery through consultations, and recruited social work staff. Our engagement increased by **76%** compared to our last highest record of 570 episodes back in 2018-19

50% of service engagement was made up of care leavers (aged 16 years+), whilst **36%** represented the engagement of C&YP aged 12-15 years. **5%** was representative of children aged 5-11 years. Males represented **36%** of the engagement, whilst females accounted for **64%**.

- Feb 2023: We developed and cofacilitated Care Planning Training with Southwark's Principal Social Worker.



Coram Voice continued to provide independent advocacy advice and to our C&YP.

Support was provided via their free phone advocacy support line, face to face in the community and across the country via their national team of advocates. This included their national Always Heard Advocacy Helpline and Safety Net Service.





RAISED ISSUES THROUGH ADVOCACY





During 2022-2023, C&YP had identified **453** separate issues, covering **56** different areas. The issues raised by C&YP included challenges with **housing**, **finances**, and **relationships with social workers/personal advisers**.



HOUSING: A high number of care leavers raised housing issues i.e., requesting moves from semiindependent accommodation, rent arrears, unsuitable accommodation, requests to move of Southwark. Coram Voice recommend that Children's Services develop a robust joint working protocol with housing to ensure a smooth transition for YP leaving care. Also, contingency plans to support YP through crisis or change of circumstances i.e., facing eviction or becoming a parent.



SW & PA RELATIONSHIPS: YP

raised concerns about allocated social workers/personal advisors. For instance, some YP highlighted that some personal advisors were unfamiliar with Southwark's housing options and were unable to provide independent support in resolving issues. Some YP were unhappy with the low level of contact with social workers/personal advisors or not having an allocated worker. Coram Voice suggested implementing a drop-in service for YP to raise issues directly with team managers/heads of service.

WHAT WE GOT UP TO

Throughout the year we also engaged in activities that allowed us to have fun, acquire new skills and raise aspirations. Again, the Virtual School were instrumental in enabling these opportunities.





In June 2022 **The Choir Collective** was launched by SpeakerBox Chair.





In July 2022 'What Work's' asked a few of our SpeakerBox members to assist with making a Young Advisor's film on research.

Aug 2022: We watched 'Hamilton' the musical, attended 'Lets Get Active' a fitness mentoring programme and went to Thorpe Park.





Aug 2022: We made a film with **London Bubble** and created a drama performance about 'Identity'. This kickstarted the development of our 'Identity campaign'.



In Oct 2022 we attended a **photography workshop**, and performed at our **Care Celebration** Event.



In Nov 2022 we were invited to attend the 'Black Panther 2' film premiere in central London, and visited an Escape Room.

POSITIVE OUTCOMES

DURING THE PAST YEAR C&YP'S ENGAGEMENT RESULTED IN .

- C&YP, particularly those experiencing change of worker or frequent placements moves, were able to sustain some level of consistency and stability with CRO and other members.
- SpeakerBox members were able to extend their reach and influence external agencies. For instance on 20/07/22 one YP cofacilitated a 'Staying Connected webinar' in partnership with Coram Voice. Since then YP has grown in confidence.
- C&YP (particularly under 12s) had fresh opportunities to engage with other care experienced C&YP, and developed new positive and sustainable relationships.
- C&YP developed and acquired new skills. For instance C&YP developed new skills in interviewing, presenting, photography and chairing their own meetings.
- C&YP developed confidence in self-advocating as well as advocating on behalf of others.
- C&YP had improved understanding of their rights.
- C&YP experienced improved emotional well-being.
- YP had improved aspirations and career paths
