## **Appendix 2: Additional Social Care Grant Funding**

Late in the day, the Government has announced some additional, one-off, social care grant, and for Southwark Council this is £3.272 million for 2024/25. Whilst welcome, the timing of this allocation unfortunately meant that we could not consider it via the Council's budget planning process and it could not be considered at Overview and Scrutiny. Senior Council officers have carefully reviewed the grant conditions and have advised the Cabinet Members and Leader on allocating this funding; and the proposed allocations are set out below.
