

I have been contacted as the Chair of the Manor T & R A by several concerned tenants and residents regarding the 24 hour liquor licence at the above premises. I would be grateful therefore if, as our local Councillor, you would represent our views at the necessary Committee.

The main objections raised are that we already suffer with unsocial street drinking, particularly in the Blue Market area, with one street drinker recently being given an ASBO. We are also concerned that minors may be approached particularly as the summer months are here, there are many primary and secondary schools in the vicinity. The street drinkers are also posing a social problem in that they are abusive to local residents necessitating removal by the Police, and often use the public areas as toilets. This is also giving parents rise for concern.
