#### **RECOMMENDATION**

1. To agree the works to be funded from the list of proposed schemes in the Rotherhithe Community Council area as set out in Appendix 1 and Appendix 2, up to the total funding available.

#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

- 2. A report was presented to the community council with officer recommended candidate roads for consideration as set out in Appendix 1 of this report back on 2 November 2011. The community council deferred its decision and requested officers to undertake further investigations of additional schemes and present the information for its consideration. Additionally at the community council meeting on 11 January 2012, officers facilitated a workshop in which local residents voted to identify the schemes they would like the community council to consider.
- 3. The revised schemes from the original instruction have been investigated and the cost estimates are presented in Appendix 1. Also, the outcome of the workshop, the schemes identified and their cost estimates are presented in appendix 2.
- 4. The community council should note that Hawkstone Road, one of the roads identified for improvement, is a principal road. As such its maintenance is funded externally by Transport for London and should not be funded by community council devolved highway funding.

#### **KEY ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION**

5. The overall budget available to the community council is £100,000 for 2012/13. Decisions are needed in April 2012 to allow for programming of works through the year and to enable officers to plan and programme these works and takes account of the Olympics and other factors such as the ongoing Thames Water Victoria Mains replacement works.

## **Community Council Selections**

6. This money can be spent on any asset renewal or replacement project selected by the community council with the caveats that it cannot be spent on traffic safety or parking schemes, non functional or decorative installations and / or non-essential works. In addition to the resurfacing selections provided it, the money (or part thereof) could be spent on minor patching and pothole repairs should a community council wish to do so.

## **Delivery**

7. Once the community council has made their selections by the method of their choice they will be designed and delivered as soon as possible in 2012/13. Any under spends or projected overspends will be reported back to Community Council for resolution or reallocation.

# **Community Impact Statement**

8. There are no specific community impact issues arising from the recommendations.
