Q1	Mrs Palmer submitted the following public questions: Is there anything the Community Council could do to help improve community relations between ethnic minorities and the host nation? The BNP feeds off misunderstandings.
A 1	Chair: This could be considered as a separate agenda item for a future DCC meeting.
	Cllr Mitchell: East Dulwich Community centre meet up for a wide range of activities and urged people to come along to attend the 'Mark of Faith ' day taking place shortly.
Q2	It is dangerous attempting to cross the road at the junction of East Dulwich Grove and Lordship Lane. Could traffic lights be placed there?
A2	Cllr Mitchell: ED Cllrs considered traffic lights at the crossing of East Dulwich – but are of the view that traffic lights would not help that junction. We might have to look at other possibilities having discussed this with officers in traffic. As long as traffic is forced to turn left in East Dulwich then the junction is manageable in their view.
Q3	Melbourne Grove / Bassano Street overhanging branches are a health and safety hazard.
А3	Cllr Mitchell agreed to speak to Mrs Palmer directly about this issue.
Q4	Melbourne Grove/junction with Colwell Rd. Cars speeding unaware of the curve in the road at that junction are dangerous?
A 4	Cllr Mitchell: Looking at various options - i.e. installing a second pedestrian crossing along Lordship Lane (near Somerfields) which he thinks is needed
Q5	Do small children and school children need to be taught kerb drill?
A 5	Cllr Mitchell agreed to speak to Mrs Palmer directly about this issue.

	Alison Squires from planning policy was present to introduce the	

SPD, Core Strategy, the officers' presentation to written responses received and to address the specific issues that were raised at DCC on April 1 2009.

Summary:

The Core Strategy replaces the Southwark plan which is a strategic document for planning in the borough. For example protecting conservation areas, traffic routes and housing etc. The SPD will provide further guidance on planning issues to determine a decision and setting new visions for Dulwich.

There are 13 policies in the core strategy document that will cover transport accessibility, energy renewal etc and encourage community facilities in an area. The affordable housing policy will encourage more family housing – i.e. more 3 or 4 beds due to demand.

Alison urged people to go on the website www.southwark.gov.uk for comments – the consultation is out until July 2009. Email Alison Squires at: alison.squires@southwark.gov.uk for queries.

Officers then responded to questions on key issues – e.g. Suburban zones and urban zones. Maps outlining the zones will shortly be available on the Council's website.

As part of the consultation process the planning policy team will be running a workshop at the Dulwich Picture Gallery on July 7 2009 between 12pm – 6pm.

Both the Core Strategy and the Dulwich SPD have already been taken to Planning Committee and Executive and both approved for consultation.

The next stages:

The next stage for the Core Strategy will be to continue to consult on the document up to July 23 and then the comments we receive and further evidence we will collect will form the production of the submission/publications version of the Core Strategy.

This will be taken to Planning Committee, Executive and Full council and if the Chair permits this will be presented again to Dulwich CC between November 2009 and January 2010.

The next stage for the Dulwich SPD will be to look at all the representation received and change the SPD where needed. This
