### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

- 1. On 20 November 2012 the Cabinet considered a report setting out the steps taken and planned to develop an investment programme to ensure sufficient quality primary school places in the short and medium term.
- 2. The Cabinet agreed:
  - that the forecast demand for primary places and associated need for the creation of additional capacity within Southwark's primary estate be noted
  - that the financial implications of the necessary expansion be noted
  - that it be noted that the cabinet member for children's services shall confirm those schools to be subject to further development of permanent expansion proposals and a co-ordinated fabric investment programme following the conclusion of further feasibility assessments
  - that it be noted that the strategic director of children's and adults services will approve a programme of temporary expansion for 2013 by December 2012

### **REASONS FOR CALL-IN**

- 3. On 29 November 2012 the Chair of Overview & Scrutiny Committee Councillor Cathy Bowman and four members of the committee (Councillors Toby Eckersley, David Hubber, David Noakes and Paul Noblet and Education Representative Leticia Ojeda) requested a call-in of the decisions on the following grounds:
  - Failure to adequately consult: Consultation has not gone beyond the initial stages that would be expected for a decision of this importance. Heads in schools that do not feature on the long-list have not been consulted at all. Nor does there appear to have been any engagement with potential new providers, such as the free-school advocates in Dulwich
  - Failure of strategy and implementation: the urgent need for additional primary provision can only be properly addressed with a cohesive, council-wide strategy. This report fails to link into the relevant policy frameworks for the borough's key regeneration project at Elephant & Castle. (Equally, the issue of additional provision is largely missing from the Elephant SPD.

- Budget: the figures outlined in the report in paragraph 41 do not bear much examination. They seem to be gross under-estimates of the likely costs. Further, there is no explanation of how any shortfall will be met should the government's *actual* funding fail to match the council's expectation

## **CALL-IN MEETING**

- 4. The committee will consider the call-in request and in particular whether or not the decision might be contrary to the policy framework or not wholly in accordance with the budget.
- 5. If, having considered the decision and all relevant advice, the committee is still concerned about it then it may either:
  - a) refer it back to the decision making person or body for reconsideration, setting out in writing the nature of its concerns, or
  - b) Refer the matter to council assembly if the decision is deemed to be outside the policy and budget framework.
- 6. If the committee does not refer the matter back to the decision making person or body, the decision shall take effect on the date of the scrutiny meeting.
