London Youth Games

This weekend saw the finals of the London Youth Games. The organisers began to say this is Southwark's year half way through the day. They were right, and so I am very pleased to announce the fantastic news that "Team Southwark" made it to the top ten, finishing **9th** overall.

I would like to congratulate all our wonderful young people, their team managers and the Southwark Sports Development Team for their very hard work in getting our teams together to achieve this result.

Southwark Reach Top Ten at London Youth Games 2013

- Team Southwark made it into the top ten this year (out of 33), finishing **9th** overall
- Team Southwark have improved by 20 places over the last five years:
 - 2009 29th
 - 2010 19th
 - 2011 18th
 - 2012 15th
 - 2013 9th
- Team Southwark claimed 11 top three victories:
 - 1st place: girls' basketball, water polo and boys' table tennis
 - 2nd place: boys' cross country, wheelchair basketball
 - 3rd place: boys' disability football, BMX, boys' handball, cycling, boys' football, girls' hockey)
- We also achieved 19 top 10 finishes
- Entered **42** sports competitions across **26** sports
- Engaged **363** young people in actual competitions and over **1,000** in the London Youth Games experience
- Team Southwark entered some new sports this year, which included weightlifting, girls' judo and girls' table tennis.

Highlights over the finals weekend included retaining the girls' basketball title for the third year in a row by beating Haringey 35-33 on Saturday afternoon and winning the boys' table tennis competition for the first time in the borough's history.
