2.	Pathway planning (at 16 years) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • How much co-production • Impact = goals shared with young people • Owned plan more likely to succeed
3.	How do you assess relationship between children and young people, practitioners and social workers? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Mitigation and quality assurance • External support workers; holding to account and measureable outcomes
4.	Young inspectors and young advisors
