

What is the Network?



Southwark Lesbian Gay, Bisexual and Transgender Network (Southwark LGBT Network) is an unincorporated association founded in 2002.

Its purpose is to build and strengthen LGBT communities in Southwark so as to improve the quality of life of LGBT people who live, work, study or socialise in Southwark and reduce our vulnerability to hate crime, harassment and discrimination.

Current Situation



Southwark is the Local Authority with the 2nd Highest LGBTQ+ Population in the country.

It is estimated that:

- **12,000** people in Southwark identify as being **Gay/Lesbian**
- **2,000** people identify as being **Bisexual**
- **2,000** identified as having a sexual orientation that was **Other**
- There are no stats around gender affirmation/transitioning

All of these stats are for adults aged 16+ ¹

How did the Community Survey arise?



- Greater intelligence on local need.
- A lack of borough specific statistics on health and well-being issues.
- The partnership with Healthwatch Southwark arose due to their function in obtaining views of local health and social care users.

Consultation Stats


- 64% of respondents felt safe in their local area.
- 51% felt safe in the borough as a whole.
- Anxiety due to fear of abuse and lack of sanctions.




Southwark LGBT Network

- 12 month increase in offences and incidents.



- Planning & Licensing




PrEP



Southwark Council has previously outlined a commitment to providing PrEP for its residents.

- Covid-19 Delays
- Department of Health £5m funding reduction
- 40% decrease in HIV infection in Men who have sex with Men.
- Anecdotal increase in chemsex in Men who have sex with men.

Concerns regarding the £5m decrease in funding for PrEP



Investment must be increased to ensure that those who most need PrEP know about it, can access it, and – where appropriate – are supported in using it.

In addition, we support calls for robust and proper investment in our creaking sexual health services, including proper investment in clinical services, peer services, and health promotion programmes.

Those services are facing the fallout of austerity and we should have a sexual health service that can provide PrEP – and all other sexual health services – to everyone who needs them.





Mental Health



Lockdown


Key points from The LGBTQ+ Lockdown Wellbeing Report (2019)¹:

- Almost four in five (79%) LGBTQ+ people said that their mental health had been negatively impacted by the coronavirus lockdown.
- Before lockdown, 21% of LGBTQ+ people said they experienced loneliness "very often" or "every day". During lockdown this more than doubles to 56% during lockdown
- 67% of under 18 LGBTQ+ people felt lonely "very often" or "every day" during lockdown.
