We wanted to write regarding the application for Megan's Deli. We live at [REDACTED]

We would like to object to the plans under the provision of it being a public nuisance.

The Deli will be in an area surrounded by houses and shops that close early in the evening. In particular we are concerned that they want a significant amount of outdoor seating on a relatively small pavement area and that is likely to be noisy and likely to block access for people using the pavement.

Also, 11.30pm is a late closing time when it comes to the area as it is mainly families with young children and we would be concerned customers would congregate outside and make a lot of noise in the evening.

As a minimum the number of outdoor seats should be significantly reduced and they should end outside service earlier than 10pm so as not to disturb local residents.

I am a resident of Gilkes Place Dulwich Village and am really concerned about the length of time that alcohol is going to be sold for purchase as off sales and also instore.

7 days a week does not give any rest for myself and also the 5 apartments that are going to be built above the restaurant.

I object about the length of time for licensing purposes and also the risk of noise disturbance and also the harm to children who use Gilkes Place and Dulwich Village to go to school.

It is sending out the wrong message to youngsters and I feel encourages under age drinking.
