- The request to call-in should give reasons for the call-in and set out any alternative course of action proposed. In particular, the request must state whether or not members believe that the decision is outside the policy or budget framework.
- A copy of the request should be sent to Everton Roberts, Head of Overview And Scrutiny (Acting).
- Please note that a member serving on a multi-ward forum (who is also a member of the
 overview and scrutiny committee) who participates in taking a decision relating to an
 executive function shall not sign a call-in request on the same decision (thus avoiding
 any conflict of interests).
